Dear Mr. Andrews:

This is in response to your letter dated December 10, 1974, concerning a guarantee of four hours pay for part-time flexible capleyees who were not scheduled to work any hours furing a pay pariod.

The Postal Service, in knoping with the intent of Article VI of the Matienal Agreement, has taken the position that part-time floatble exployees in offices with 200 or more man years of exployees in these scheduled to work a minimum of four (4) hours each pay period. Part-time floatble exployees in these offices with less than 100 man years of exployeent are to be scheduled to work a minimum of two (2) hours each pay period.

In those instances where the exployees in question were not scheduled for duty during a pay period, they would be entitled to receive two or four hours pay whichever is applicable.

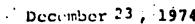

This is in response to your letter dated December 10, 1974, concerning a cuarantee of four hours pay for part-time flexible employees who were not scheduled to work any hours during a pay period.

The Postal Service, in keeping with the intent of Article VI of the National Agreement, has taken the position that part-time flexible employees in offices with 200 or more man years of employment are to be scheduled to work a minimum of four (4) hours each pay period. Port-time flexible employees in those offices with less than 200 man years of employment are to be scheduled to work a minimum of two (2) hours each pay period.

In those instances where the employees in question were not scheduled for duty during a pay period, they would be entitled to receive two or four hours pay whichever is applicable.
