Paragraph 1, section 464, Postal Laws and Regulations of 1940, as amended, is further amended to read as follows:

"464. Mail handlers shall not be assigned to clerical duties. The work to which mail handlers shall be assigned consists of loading and neloading motortrucks, trucking mail in the office, setting up and taking down bag racks, dumping mail, making simple distribution of parcels where no scheme knowledge is involved, operating cancelling machines, cleaning and oiling machines, conveyors, etc., carrying mail from cancelling machines to distribution cases and from letter drope to facing tables, handling empty—ouches and sacks, and such other similar work as the postmaster may direct."
