Dear Pat:

This is in response to your November 29, 2006 correspondence in which you ask, "What is Postal Service Headquarters position on putting employee identification numbers (EINs) on employee badges?"

On July 12, 2006, the Postmaster General, John E. Potter, issued a letter regarding the Postal Service's role in safeguarding sensitive business and personal information. The letter states that the Postal Service wherever possible, will stop printing Social Security numbers and employee identification numbers, unless it is necessary to do business.

Additionally, Homeland Security Presidential Directive (HSPD–12) will require the Postal Service to encode employee identification numbers as barcodes on the new employee badges. At no time will the EIN be printed as a number on employee identification badges.



RE: Time Badges Including Employees' EIN Numbers

This letter is in reference to the Postal Service's software program requiring Employees' Identification Numbers to be included on badges.

We have a great concern of the privacy violation since all employees use their EIN numbers to submit bids, thrift savings, health plan benefits, etc. In as much, we would like to know why this policy is being implemented, which would violate the privacy regulations of the ASM.

To include this information (EIN) on the badges would also conflict with the memo from John E. Potter dated July 12, 2006 (SEE ATTACHED) which states, "We are taking aggressive steps to safeguard personal information and other business sensitive data". He further states, "Wherever possible, we will also stop printing Social Security numbers or Employee ID numbers unless doing so is necessary to do business".

How is it necessary to do business by placing the EIN on badges? Please notify me as soon as possible as to headquarters' position on putting EIN on employees' badges. I can be reached at (202) 842-4220.
