This is in reference to the Mail Processing fork
Assignment Guidelines（R．I．399）issued February 16，1979．
The following revisions are to be incorporated into this document：

1．In Operations 110－129 the words＂opening and traying＂ will be added to the operation description．This rescription charge accurately reflects the work currently being performed．

2．Item 3 in Operations 110－129 will be revised as follows：
＊Dumping sacks，pouches，or containers．Cull／ segregate mail by type／characteristics and make basic local／out－of－town splits to trays，hampers， gurneys，conveyors，nutting trucks，or other containers．

This cinange reflects that，in operations where culling is not an integral part of the distribution function， the primary craft for assignment of this work is mail handier．

3．Operations 140－149 will be zこōec to reflãさ fiulミi－Position Flat Sorting liacinne distribution．The primary craft for the machine distribution of all classes of flats will be iaen＝íied $E$ e ciミrk．
