Dear Brother and Sisters:
Attached please find a notice received from James C. Gildea, Assistant Postmaster General, Labor Relations Department, USPS, dated February 28, 1984, outlining revisions to various sections of the Mail processing Work Assignment Guidelines, commonly referred to as Regional Instructions jy9 (RI 399).

Please note in particular the revisions that are listed in parts 2 and 4 of $M r$. Gildea's letter. These revisions involve the addition of specific notations of the culiing function in Operations 110-129 and 180-189. In all these operations, the culling function is being defined as a Mail Handler primary craft function.

You will note this Union has experienced problems with the failure of RI 399 to clearly define this function in the operations cited a'ove. These revisions will correct that failure. The Union will be required to show that the culling of mail in these operations can be efficiently separated from the distribution function in keeping with Part IIC of the Implemantation Guidelines; I refer to page 113 of the Natioril Agreement for your information.

I am pleased to advise you of these changes as $I$ believe that they will further assist Mail Handler Union representatives in obtaining work that properly belongs to members of the Mail Handlers, Dargaining unit.

The folloving revisions are to be incorporated into this document:

1. In operations 110-129 the vords opening and traying* Will be added to the operation description. - This description change accurately reflects the work currently beling performed.
2. Item 3 in Operations 110-129 vill be revised as follows

- Dumping sacks, pouches, or contalners. Cull/ segregate mall by type/characterlstles and make basic local/out-ot-town aplits to trays, hampers. gurneys, conveyors, nutting trucks, or other contalners.

This change reflects that, in operations where culling is not an integral part of the distribution function, the primary craft for assignment of this work is mail handler.
3. Operations 140-149 vill be added to reflect Multi-position plat Sorting kachine distribution. The primary craft for the machine distribution of all classes of flats will be identified as clerx.
4. Item 3 is Operations 180-189 will be revised as follows

- Dumping sacks, pouches, or"̈ontalners. Cull/ segregate mall by type/characteristics and make basie local/out-of-tovn splits to trays, hampers, gurneys, conveyors, nutting trucks, or other $i_{i}$ containers.

This represents the are type of. change as identified above in Operations 110-129.
