



**Re:** New Grievance Appeal Address

*Brothers and Sisters:*

*Beginning May 15, 2011, APWU officers will send MANAGEMENT grievance appeals to a new address. This includes all appeals to Step 3 (including employee claims) and all appeals to arbitration, including direct appeals. The USPS is closing its five grievance processing centers in the field and will be consolidating their grievance processing at a single National Grievance/Arbitration Processing Center. Remember that these appeals are time-sensitive.*

*Locals please note that addresses for copies and files that you currently send to your NBAs will remain unchanged.*

Notwithstanding this assurance, please update your records accordingly in preparation.*
