



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
Between the U.S. Postal Service
and the
American Postal Workers Union, AFL-CIO
and
National Post Office Mail Handlers, Messengers
and Group Leaders, AFL-CIO


It is hereby agreed by the United States Postal Service, the American Postal Workers Union, AFL-CIO, and the National Post Office Mailhandlers, Watchmen, Messengers and Group Leaders Division of the Laborers' International Union of the North America, AFL-CIO, to submit the following issues to arbitration:

1. Whether the bargaining-unit position entitled Mail Processor, SP 2-37 was assigned to the appropriate national craft unit.
2. Whether the bargaining-unit position entitled Mail Distributor, SP 2-200 was assigned to the appropriate national craft unit.

The parties agree to accept the respective arbitration Awards rendered pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding as final and binding. This Memorandum of Understanding applies only to the issues referenced above and to the respective National Agreements. It is not a procedure applicable to the parties with respect to other issues or matters appealed to arbitration.
